

#### Important Instructions for Admission in P.G. Programme for the Academic Session 2020-22

- 1. The P.G. Admission process will be divided into two Groups- Group A and Group B except LL.M. programme.
- 2. Group A will consist of 80% of the total intake capacity both subject wise and category wise available to the home University candidates.
- 3. Group B will consist of the students of home university who fail to place themselves in Group A on grounds of merit, Candidates from other UGC recognised Universities, and the students from the previous Academic years but not before the AY 2018 of UGC recognised Universities.
- 4. Considering the pandemic situation, there will be no admission test and for both Group A & B admission will be held through publication of Merit List- to be prepared on the basis of Marks obtained in Graduation Level of their respective courses/ subjects.
- 5. After Registration the Merit List will be published. This Merit List will contain the names of all the eligible Candidates on the basis of the Marks obtained in Graduation Level of their respective courses/ subjects. Where the marks is the same, the marks secured in Higher Secondary will be considered and after that the date of birth where the marks secured by the candidates in Higher Secondary is the same. Merit list will be published subject wise and category wise. The first merit list will be published for Group A only.
- 6. After publication of Merit List if any discrepancies/ anomalies/ flaws found by the candidates, they may contact the helpline or helpdesk through mobile/ e-mail etc. for rectification of error but it should be done within the due date as provided under the lists of important dates.
- 7. After publication of merit List, the Candidates have to apply their preferences/ choice for the institute where they intend to take admission. The option List will contain the name of the University Departments and all the Colleges where that course is taught and the students may choose all the institutes as First Preference, second preference etc. or may choose any specific institute or institutes.
- 8. After getting the preferences of the candidates, the **First Admission List** will be published. Admission list will be prepared on the basis of merit as well as the preferences opted by the candidates. Merit will always get priority in preparing admission list.
- 9. If any seat lies vacant from the seats available to the students of Group A, then the subsequent list will be published but only within a reasonable time period in consideration of academic calendar.
- 10. This merit list will not include the students from the previously published admission list (s)
- 11. After publication of merit list for Group B the admission list (s) will be published after **fulfilling the criteria/ stipulations provided in Para-6, Para-7**
- 12. Admission list will contain both Unreserved as well as Reserved Category list.
- **13. Reserved Category Students will be asked through SMS and e-mail to use their choice** whether they intend to get admission by **opting general list or through reserved Category.**
- 14. Candidates can take admission only by payment of required fees through portal and online payment gateway.
- 15. Candidates will get the chance of upgradation in their preferred institutes if any seat remains or will become vacant. The admission fee in case of upgradation will be adjusted.

- 16. Only the admitted candidates will get the chance for upgradation. The candidates who will not take the admission as per the admission list published by this University, their candidature will not be considered for any further admission process.
- 17. If required, subsequent admission list will be published after the publication of first admission list for the students of Group B only.

#### Steps to be followed to get admission:

1. Students whose names are there in Admission list will login into the admission portal using their log in id and password.

2. Students who are of reserved category and whose names have appeared both as Reserved and General category will choose in which category, he/she wants to take admission.

3. Student will click to the pay button and will be redirected to the payment gateway.

4. After successful payment student will return to the admission portal and will download the payment receipt by clicking the download receipt link.

5. After getting admission student can opt for up-gradation for being considered in the next admission list to get suitable place as per his/ her preferences as submitted.

6. Only the admitted candidates will get the chance for upgradation. The candidates who will not take the admission as per the admission list published by this University, their candidature will not be considered for any further admission process.

What is Shaw's attitude about theme of "Love" and "alap"? > Shave have favon the title from the opening like of Roman Epie poet Vingil's aconk The Aeneid The Latin version of the line is - "Anma Vinunque Cano", which is translated as 'of anot and the man, I sing'. I The theme of "lave and wear" is interserven in this play. In the fitle Anna and the Man the word "arms" implies the weapons and ammunition that is used during the war. The word "army" also has another connotation and it means the "arms of lover". So, love is another issue here. But show has not glowified theme of " love and war" like other writers. He treated these things in a different penspective. The momantic tradition of asar ignore some bitter realities of wars - the suffering the lass, the deprivations.

The roomantic tradition of war ignore some bitter realities of wars — the suffering, the lass, the deprivation. Show wants to make his audience aware of this other side of war which is often overloaked. Sengius, Raina and Catherine all alleast initially. view war os a kind of stage where an honourable man can through browery and purity, achieve glory. Here Shaw brings the chanceles like Bluntschli, who is a & Swiss memoriary to project the wildness and fulility fare.

For the Swiss, Captain, being a soldier is just a profession and usars its just a business. He feels that though saldiers fight for adventure, fight for their country. but first of all they are human beings. And like any other human beings they acould also like to live their life os long of they can . Eventually, both Sengins and Raina adopt Bluntschli's viewes. He also destroys Raina's nomantic idea of asars and heroism who he proves that the best soldiers are often not identified of such on the outside.

On the other hand, share presents the complexities of love in real life. Social conventions in shares time period included public and formal courting, parental approval and consideration of social status and arealth of each partner. But the characters in this play like Raina and Sergius realises that they do not really like Raina and Sergius realises that they do not really love each other and break the conventions. They finally end up with a person that is best suited to them.

Show shows us the impationality and absundity of acting by false systems of behaviour that will force us to live less fulfilling lives. Show does not simply dismiss pomance and heroism, he redefines them in the light of realism. 3) How fan the play Anns and the Man is an anti-romantic Comedy? > The sublitle of the play cleanly shows the nature of the play. The play is an anti-nomantic comedy. The play is an anti-nomantic because in it show has allocked the nomantic and idealistic notions about life and it is a comedy because in it he has exposed and laughed at the nomentic illusions about love and wear. In Aroms and the Man Shaw exposes the unsoundness of the normantic view of war. There was a popular view that was its a somantie game which gives a man the opportunity of displaying his heroism. But Shake pidicules the normantic views about was and soldiering in the play. The play opens with a note of nomance and henoism. Raina is a nomantic girl, who is engaged with Sengins, a "Byronie hero", who has gone to the battlefield like a knight. He makes a cavaloy charge and wind the victory and becomes the hopo. Both Raina and Songives live in a world of pomance and unpedity and for that theirs romance is easily shattered coming contact with reality. It is Bluntschli who makes Raina aware of how foolish notion about war. He tells how that Sergius is a fool and he and his regiment nearly committed suicide only the pistal misselfine. Gradually, both Raina and sergins understand Theirs

hellowness and Serging said that "was is nothing but the "coward's ant". In Arms and the Man Shake takes a realistic view about love and marriage and exposes the hollowness of somantic leve . Both Raina and Sergins have "higher love" for each other But soon their "higher love" shattened. Sergins made lave with Louka, the made servant behind Raina's back. And Sengins also learned that Raina made love to Bluntschli. This, the cobused of permantic net is broken and the search light of reality vidicules the In order to give his play an anti-romantic tone. Shaw has taken the help of exaggeration of reality. A fugitive soldiers may demand food when he is starving, but it is hand to believe that he would domand chocolate . In this play, Bluntschli demands chocolate from Raina after he returns from baltlefield. Again. although Bluntschli says that soldiers are born foals. it is not credible to them not to observe a pistal lying before them, even after a thorough search while a maid servant like Louka notices it as soon of she enters the room. To conclude, are can say that the play Anny and the Man, which opens with a nomantic setting is obviously an anti-momantic comedy. Shaw has excelently exposed and reidiculat the nomantic notion of lave, was and manniage. A is therefore aptly said by chesterton - "The play is built

not on pathos, but on bathes on anti-climax."

4) What is the underlying theme in W.B. Yeats's poem. "Leda and the Swan"? Bring out the mythical allusion of the poem.

To one very significant theme in the poom "Leda and the Swan" is the theory of history. Yeals famously believed that history is a series of interlocking and repeating patterns. The poem is bessed on the story of Leda and Zens. Zens in the form of a Swan raped Leda, which according to myth, led to the Trojan war and the Golden Age of Greece. The poom treats this moment between Leda and Zens of a mythological and historical fipping point.

Ofcourse, the poem makes clean that the thing that set this all in motion wors an act of sexual vialation and that this violence, in turn led to more terribly violent wents before that Galden Age emerged.

Accordingly, the poem is also often need ors an allusion to the Jason of Christianity. Henc Leta's experience also calls to mind another asoman's experience with divine conception - Many, the mothers of Jesus Christ. Yeats himself arote in this book <u>A vision</u> that he saw Leda's rape of Similars to the annunciation of Angel Gabriel that Many will conceive a child by God. Liversise, just like Helon have a transformative effect on Greek History, Many's Son Jesus christ also had a transformative effect on global history.

Many readers have interpreted the poem of an allesion to the colonial relationship between Great Britain and Ireland and more specifically to the Irish war I independence. Britain like the mighty Savan fully conquered Ireland, the helpless richim like Leda. However, the civil war in Ireland was an immense turning point for Ireland and England. Thus, Just as Zeus's pape "engendens" the rise of the Greek Golden Age, the English domination of Ireland eventually gave rise to Irish independence.

The speaker petells the story from a Greek mythology. The Story is about the rape of Leda by Zeus. Zeus, the father of the Olympian Gods. took the form of a Swan in order to seduce Leda, daughter of King Thestins. This conception posults in the birth of the most beautiful aroman, Helen. Helen was kidnapped by the Trojans and this incident caused the great Trojan war. A brought the end of a mythological erra and engendered the pise of the Greek Golden Age.

6. on critically explain the theme of modernity in T.S. Eliot's poon The Love Song of J. Alfred Prufroen. > T.S. Eliot's "The love Song of J. Alfred Profroex" Cappies the characteristics of modernist poetry. With the annival of "The Love Song of Y. Alfred Prufnoen", the nomantic concept of poetry has been changed. The poetry is no longer sponteneous overflow of powerful feelings. It is not a turning loose of ometion, it is not an expression of personality. Instead, it is an escope from emotion and from personality. While the romantic and victorian poets sought beauty and freedom from tension in nature, Eljot searched poetic element in the ugliness of modern Unban life. He conveys the sondidness of modern Unloan life by mentioning of "pestless nights in one-night cheap hotels and sawdust pestaurants". The expressions like "Pools that stand in chains" and "the soot that falls from chimneys" also nefer to the insanity conditions and the industrial pollution of modern cities.

The interest of the poem centres around the protagonist 3 Alfred Proutroex. He represents an individual as well as the universal type. He has no claim to be called Hero, as the traditional nomantic poetry can justly be so called. His indecision, his nervousness and self belittling put the stamp of the anti-hero upon him. He sponds his time by uttening "Do I dare" and "Do I dane", but has not the courself to declane his love. He is unlike the horo of romanhie poetny. over sensitive about himself. His baldness of head and thinness of arms and legs lead him to think of parting his have behind or asearing the bottoms of his trous ens rolled up, but he can not escape from the unpleasant thought "I grow old. I grow ald." Being a split pensonality, he is one to whom, expasing of the heart to a woman seems to be a sort of an obscene experience. This, unlike romantic hero, he shows his over Sensitive cowardice and pervension.

While pomantic poetny dealt with love, with all its glamoup, "The Love Song of J. Alfred Prinfroeu" treats love os an object of fear and anxiety for which loven is unable to Express his love. Also the women in this poom, though are as beautiful as of romantic poems, their difference is emphasized by their cultural pretence - "their talk of Michale Angelo" and their habit of fixing Someone "in a foomulated phrase".

The use of callequial expressions, unusual line length use of allusiveness, objective connectative go to make it a modern poem. Thus, the Love Song of S. Alfred Bufroek" provos a tood setter for modern poetry and a definite departure from the traditional romantic poems. "Shaw takes the title of the play Arms and the Man from the opening lines of Dryden's translation of Vingil's Aereid: "arma vinusclave cano" ("arms and the man I ring" or "I ring of arms and of man...") Shaw glorified I war shaw I take "arms and the men" and o mitted "I ring" to assent antiwar war riunds. The original title of the play was "Alphs and Balkas" Later I shaw revised the I title. The subtille of the play is "Anti-romantic comedy". Originally the subtitle was "a romantic comedy". Shaw revised the subtitle because he felt that the audience was more concerned about romantic aspects of the play and ignored Shaw's anti-romantic treatment of I love I and wart.

The play has two major themes: one is love and the other is war. These themes are interwoven, for shaw believed that while war is evil and stupid, marriage desirable and good, both had become wrapped in noncantic ullusions which led to disastrous way and also to unhappy marriages.

In <u>Arms and the Man</u>, Shaw expresses his anti-romantic attitude towards lave and war. In the play he does not idealise wor the exposes the hollowness of the love and war. He also exposes the follies of romantic love the shows that love is not a romance but a reality. To him love and mavoriage should be based on economic security and mutual runderstanding. Evidently, Shaw's propose in this splay is to attack the momentic notion of war (Artms) and the neo-platonic mismeading of

Higher Love? Still, <u>Arms and the Man</u> is not an anti-ware play, but nother a vatinical assault on those who would glorify the hornors of war. Show has apply called <u>Arms and the Man</u> 'an anti-romantic comedy? In the title 'Arms' stands for the romantic glorrification of war and solder voldiering and Mam' stands for Life force?

Arms and the Man, subtitled as an 'antinomantic comedy', is a satire on the conventional idealistic views on war and Higher Love. The play has two major themes : one is war, the othern is love These themes are interwoven, for Shaw believed that while war is evil and stupid, marriage desirable and good, both had become wrappled in romantic Hillusions which led to disastrows wars and also to unhappy marriages. The romantic view of war is based for the idealistic notion that man fight because they are hences and that the soldier who takes the pisks wins the greatest glory and is the greatest hore. Shaw is against the horror of war and

Thus, V in <u>Arms and the Man</u> Shaw expresses his anti-romantic attitude towards love and war. In the play he not only exposes the hollowner of the love and war but also exposes the follies of romantic love. To him love is not a romance but a reality love and movinge should be based on economic vecwity and matual understanding. In the play he tries to find out the truth of behind the goeb of romance and respectability. 5. - **9. Objective:** Some major objectives of this Webinar is: The study of gender and society provides the window of opportunity to understand the cusp of gender-oriented issues of our society. It also creates the conditions for discerning the domain of a much-contested façade of social discourse. The seminar helps shape and reshape our overtly lopsided understanding about the conceptualization of women in our presumed social structure. The issue of gender study equally offers a plethora of insightful inquisitions that raises a basketful of queries that has so long been patently entrenched in our socially-crafted institutions. However, the institutionalized gender-matrix education is pitifully inadequate to feed into the socially equal parameters of human society. Admittedly, the seminar has attained the purpose of hammering the semblance of conceptual and practical ideation and understanding of the prism of gender study in a supposedly hands-on way.
- **10. Outcome:** The issue of gender and society is a very relevant and pragmatic in terms of its intrinsic grounding in the discipline of social science. It also raises scores of questions on how to construct our ideas, views and attitudes toward the society in which an overtly co-relative structure of an otherwise equivalent social ambience seems to be elusive. However, the practical approach to the prevalent social structure construes a kind of society in which the sense of reciprocal relationship between men and women is opulently skewed. The seminar has blatantly hammered the nuances of an equal social structure and apparently fed into the minds of the participants who have made it a point to participate in the seminar. Equally, it has also raised some burning questions on how to address the challenges that is constantly plaguing the gender-centric social structure.




