We observe this day to rejuvenate our thoughts relating to the diversified fields of education. In this propitious day, we also make our mind to promote education for our learners and the society at large as we think that the education is the best means of ensuring social justice, national integrity and communal harmony.

This year the foundation day of Ramananda College brings a greater significance to us as we are in the verge of celebrating the Platinum Jubilee (75 years celebration) of this educational institution. Today we are going to inaugurate the yearlong celebration of the Platinum Jubilee of Ramananda College. Alienated in several phases, this celebration will come to an end on the 75th Foundation day of Ramananda College (01.07.2020) with apposite pomp and splendour.

Short history of Ramananda College:

Ramananda College is a pioneering higher-educational institution located at Bishnupur, within the district of Bankura. It is the sole co-educational Degree College with PG courses recognized by the UGC within Bishnupur town. Since its inception in 1945, this institution has been serving the cause of higher education in the local community and also of students from far-away, remote villages. Even today students from other districts are studying here.

Sri Ramnalini Chakraborty, freedom-fighter and social worker of Bishnupur, Sri Radhagobinda Roy, founder-principal of this college and ex-minister, Govt. of West Bengal and other eminent community members of Bishnupur decided to establish this college here. Sri Ramnalini Chakraborty, the Koley family, Sri Anil Kumar Bhattacharya, members of the Friends' Union Club and the community maximally funded the costs for building this college. The college is named after the son of the soil, Sri Ramananda Chattopadhyay (1865-1943), journalist, editor and scholar who was active during the Bengal Renaissance.

Initially the college was affiliated to the University of Calcutta, and later to the University of Burdwan and now under the affiliation of the Bankura University since 1st January, 2017. The college is recognized by the UGC under Sections 2F and 12B. As the college was established before Independence, it predates both the creations of the UGC and the University of Burdwan. In 2015, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) re-accredited (2nd cycle as B) the College with 2.75 score. Further, with the introduction of different Post Graduate

19. NSS activities during 2018-19:

Ramananda College currently has two NSS units: Unit I and Unit-II. Regular NSS activities are organized on Sunday and NSS classes are conducted in the middle of the week within class hours. "One Day State Level Seminar on Environmental Awareness" has been organized by NSS, Ramananda College in 20th December, 2018. Special NSS camps are organized in the adopted villages yearly. This year seven days special NSS camp (University level) was held in Pansiuli & Mansa Village, Bishnupur, in 14th to 20th March 2019. An awareness camp on thalassemia was organized by NSS units on 14th March, 2019; and a medical camp for detection of thalassemia among the college students was organized by NSS units and Student Welfare Committee of the College on 20th March, 2019. Other programmes on different social issues are held throughout the year.

20. NCC activities during 2018-19:

The College has a functional NCC unit attached to the 53 Bengal Battalion. Lt. Dr. Deepak Kumar Singh is fulltime Associate NCC Officer (ANO) of the college. The NCC training is conducted on Tuesday. The NCC unit takes active part in the diversified activities organized by the college authority.

21. Netaji Subhas Open University-Ramananda College Study Centre (Code No.-J-09):

Ramananda College has a NSOU study centre. Dr. Deepak Kumar Singh is acting as the coordinator of this study centre. During the academic year 2018-19, 130 students are admitted in different P.G. courses, while 15 students are admitted in B.L.I.S. course, 01 student is admitted in M.L.I.S. course and 335 students are admitted in B.D.P. course.

22. Activities of Indira Gandhi Open University-Ramananda College Study Centre (CODE No.-2825-D) during 2018-19:

Ramananda College has a special IGNOU study centre. Prof. Ajit Debnath is acting as the coordinator of this study centre. The centre offers 14 professional and job-oriented courses. The centre has 17 approved academic counsellors. The academic counsellors are actively and judiciously involved in the task of evaluation of assignments and counselling of learners. The number of newly and re-registered scholars is 90 during the academic session of 2018-19. The centre has two academic supporting staff. Regular counselling sessions are held as per IGNOU norms. The main aim of the study centre is to cater to the needs of the learners as well as reach out to scholars spread across different strata of the society.

23. Activities of Career Advancement Centre during 2018-19:

The Career Advancement Centre (CAC) started its journey on 2016, aims to train students to develop their professional skills for different competitive examinations and gives information to the students regarding different courses after graduation and job opportunities in different spheres. The Centre makes contact with various companies for campus interviews and also arranges off-campus interviews.
