We offer our best wishes to all the teachers, non-teaching staff members, hostel employees, students, research scholars, counsellors, alumnae and all other dignitaries.

We observe this day to remember the ideals of our founders, the principles of the individual after whom this college is named, and to remind ourselves of the grave duty we bear in furthering the education of our society. We do so as we believe that education is the best means of ensuring social justice, national integrity and communal harmony. The institution has just completed 77 years of its responsibility as a sentinel of higher education in the Bishnupur sub-division of Bankura district. It is carrying forward this tradition of excellence by embracing the past, celebrating the present and building the future.

Over the past year, we have continued to grapple with new challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. We have improved our online learning processes and induced a culture of study using virtual means. We have continued to ensure that students do not suffer in terms of their studies, and their progress is tracked continuously through multiple means.

I am delighted to inform you that, in 2021, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) has awarded Ramananda College a B++ grade with a CGPA of 2.83 in the third cycle of assessment of the college. This will inspire us to take the college to greater heights in future.

This year has not been without its tragedies. Apart from the losses suffered due to the pandemic among the wider local community, it was especially hard for us to lose our non-teaching staff member Debabrata Pal (Debu), who succumbed to a previously undetected illness after several days in hospital. On behalf of the college, I extend my condolences to the members of his family. I also extend our condolences to the families of our former faculty members Prof. Shaktipada Bose (Political Science), Prof. Sanatan Pan (Zoology), and Prof. Rampada Mondal (History), who also passed away during this year.

Short History of Ramananda College:

Ramananda College is a pioneering higher-educational institution located at Bishnupur, within the district of Bankura. It is the sole co-educational Degree College with PG courses recognized by the UGC within the town of Bishnupur. Since its inception in 1945, this institution has been serving the cause of higher education in the local community and also of students from far-away, remote villages. Even today students from other districts are studying here.

Sri Ramnalini Chakraborty, an eminent freedom-fighter and social worker of Bishnupur, Sri Radhagobinda Roy, the founder-principal of this college and a former minister in the Government of West Bengal, and other eminent community members of Bishnupur decided to establish this college here. Sri Ramnalini Chakraborty, the Koley family, Sri Anil Kumar Bhattacharya, members of the Friends' Union Club and the local community provided the bulk of the funds required for building of this college. The college is named after a son of the soil, Sri Ramananda Chattopadhyay (1865-1943), a journalist, editor and scholar who was active during the Bengal Renaissance.

Initially, the college was affiliated to the University of Calcutta, later to the University of Burdwan and is now affiliated to Bankura University since 1st January, 2017. The college is recognized by the UGC under Sections 2(F) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956. As the college was established before Independence, it pre-dates both the creations of the UGC and the University of Burdwan. In 2021, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) re-accredited the College (in the 3rd cycle)

with a score of 2.83 (Grade B++). Furthermore, with the introduction of different Post Graduate Courses in Sciences and Humanities, the college has become a constituent PG college of the Bankura University. Now the college is compliant with the visions of RUSA.

The college dealt with the challenges faced by the COVID-19 pandemic through a shift to e-learning and online assessments. Now, it is adapting itself to educating students in hybrid mode, as recommended by the University Grants Commission.

2. Academic Standards and Results

Teachers possessing the qualifications mandated by the University Grants Commission (UGC) are appointed through the West Bengal College Service Commission (WBCSC). Along with the non-teaching staff, they are engaged in serving the college. State-Aided College Teachers have also been appointed to meet the needs of the students. Every year, some students obtain University ranks and a good number of them secure First Classes in the university examinations. In the last academic session (2020-2021), 10 Honours students obtained an "Outstanding" grade in the University Final UG Examinations, while 66 Honours students and 23 Programme students secured an "Excellent" grade. 25. NSS Activities during 2021-22:

Ramananda College has two NSS unit with two hundred volunteers. There are enrolled every year in the month of July and are equally distributed in both Units I & II. They complete their course after two years of successful involvement. All the volunteers of Units I and II engage in various activities together every month. To keep the college campus clean, all volunteers take necessary steps on a regular basis. The college has organized a class twice every week to motivate and improve their knowledge and general awareness. This year, volunteers were very enthusiastic to participate in the National Camp. Every year, NSS volunteers have celebrated and organized various occasions and events on the college campus and adopted village areas. Unfortunately, in this session, no single activity has physically been held due to the restrictions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. However, some programmes have been organized in online mode and one volunteer has participated in the Pre-Selection RD Camp at Guwahati.

26. NCC Activities during 2021-22:

The College has a functional NCC unit attached to the 53 Bengal Battalion. Lieutenant Dr. Deepak Kumar Singh is the full-time Associate NCC Officer (ANO) of the college. NCC training is conducted on Tuesdays. The NCC cadets take part in different types of NCC camps organized by Battalion and Group HQs, as well as in various activities organized by the college authority.

27. Netaji Subhas Open University-Ramananda College Study Centre (Code No. J-09) during 2021-22:

Ramananda College has a NSOU study centre. Dr. Deepak Kumar Singh is the coordinator of this study centre. During the academic year 2021-22, 142 students are admitted in different P.G. courses, while 24 students were admitted to the B.L.I.S. course, 5 students were admitted to the M.L.I.S. course and 436 students were admitted to the B.D.P. course.

28. Activities of the Indira Gandhi Open University-Ramananda College IGNOU Special Study Centre (CODE No. 2825-D) during 2021-22:

There is an IGNOU special study centre within the campus of Ramananda College. Prof. Ajit Debnath is the Coordinator of the study centre. The centre offers 14 professional and job-oriented courses. The study centre has 20 approved Academic Counsellors. The Academic Counsellors are actively engaged in the process of evaluation of assignments and counselling sessions of the learners. The number of newly registered and re-registered learners is 85 during the academic session of 2021-22. The centre has two part-time academic supporting staff involved in the official work of the centre. Regular counselling sessions are held as per IGNOU norms. The main aim of the study centre is to meet the demands of learners coming from different segments of society.

29. Activities of Vidyasagar University-D.D.E. Centre during 2021-22:

There is a Vidyasagar University-D.D.E. Centre within the campus of Ramananda College. Prof. Rajesh Guin is the Coordinator of the study centre. For the academic year 2021-22, no information about admissions has been forwarded to the college from Vidyasagar University.

30. Activities of the Career Advancement Centre during 2021-22:

The Career Advancement Centre (CAC) started its journey on 2016. It aims to train students to develop their professional skills for different competitive examinations and gives information to the students about different courses after graduation and job opportunities in different spheres. The Centre makes contact with various companies for campus interviews and also arranges off-campus interviews. In 2021-22, the Career Advancement Centre conducted these programmes:

- "Uttaran: An Initiative For Competitive Examinations", organized in association with the Bishnupur S.D.O., on 06.10.2021. This was a one-day workshop on career counselling. Interested students were asked to appear in a test, and the top 50 students in terms of scores were offered free coaching for various civil service entrance examinations.
- A "Workshop-cum-Training Programme for Upcoming Staff Selection Programme" was
 organized on 12.03.2022 in collaboration with RICE Education, Medinipur, where students
 were given advice by Soumya Banerjee (Manager, Academic Operations) and Sujay
 Kumar Das (Expert Teacher, Mathematics) about how to prepare for various competitive
 examinations.
- A "Seminar and Mock Test" was organized on 26.05.2022 in collaboration with Unacademy with a focus on the upcoming WBPSC entrance examination.
- A campus recruitment drive where Svatantra Microfin Pvt. Ltd, an Aditya Birla Group company, visited the campus on 27.05.2022 and conducted interviews for the post of Field Officer in their firm.

31. Initiatives Undertaken towards Student Development during 2021-22

(i) We have taken an initiative to coach the college football team every morning with our expert teachers. We also supply appropriately nutritious food to the players to help them in their training and also to provide them with one of their daily meals.

(ii) We have taken the initiative to provide mid-day meals for needy and meritorious students (about 100) of our college free of cost. This noble project is called the Annasatra Prakalpa. It was started from 27th September 2016 with the full support of former Governing Body President Dr. Shyamal Santra. We have resumed this programme after offline classes started in November 2021
