



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

About College: Ramananda College is a pioneering higher-educational institution located at Bishnupur, within the district of Bankura. It is the sole co-educational Degree College with PG courses recognized by the UGC within Bishnupur town. Since its inception in 1945, this institution has been serving the cause of higher education in the local community and also of students from far-away, remote villages. Even today students from other districts are studying here.

Sri Ramnalini Chakraborty, freedom-fighter and social worker of Bishnupur, Sri Radhagobinda Roy, founder-principal of this college and ex-minister, Govt. of West Bengal and other eminent community members of Bishnupur decided to establish this college here. Sri Ramnalini Chakraborty, the Koley family, Sri Anil Kumar Bhattacharya, members of the Friends' Union Club and the community maximally funded the costs for building this college. The college is named after the son of the soil, Sri Ramananda Chattopadhyay (1865-1943), journalist, editor and scholar who was active during the Bengal Renaissance.

Initially the college was affiliated to the University of Calcutta, and later to the University of Burdwan and now under the affiliation of the Bankura University since 1st January, 2017. The college is recognized by the UGC under Sections 2F and 12B. As the college was established before Independence, it predates both the creations of the UGC and

the University of Burdwan. In 2015, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) re-accredited (2nd cycle) the College with 2.75 score. Further, with the introduction of different Post Graduate Courses in Science and Humanities, the college has become a constituent college of the Bankura University. 1. Energy conservation:

As per the Energy Conservation Act, 2001, Energy Audit is defined as "the verification, monitoring and analysis of use of energy including submission of technical report containing recommendations for improving energy efficiency with cost benefit analysis and an action plan to reduce energy consumption". Energy use is clearly an important aspect of campus sustainability and thus requires no explanation for its inclusion in the assessment. An old incandescent bulb uses approximately 60W to 100W while an energy efficient light emitting diode (LED) uses only less than 10 W. Energy auditing deals with the conservation and methods to reduce its consumption related to environmental degradation. It is therefore essential that any environmentally responsible institution examine its energy use.



Use of renewable energy:

The College manly uses conventional energy sources. Apart from that the renewable solar energy source is found to installed to reduce load on the non-conventional sources.

3. Rain water harvesting:

At present the rain water harvesting is too much essential for the preservation of ground water which is still extracting continuously. Ramananda College practices rain water harvesting in two ways basically-Roof top harvesting and Surface run-off harvesting which contributes a lot for the preservation of ground water storage, sustainable development by water conservation and well-balanced in physical environment. At college, the Roof top harvesting particularly practices near eastern side of college playground where roof top harvest connection is drained in an artificial well. It is utilised for various purposes such as sprinkle irrigation in flower gardens and dropped point irrigation in flower trees and others located within campus and also maintain a hygienic environment at college campus.



4 Plantation:

The College campus has a vegetational coverage comprising herbs, shrubs and trees. This vegetational coverage regulates the health of the ecosystem of the College. Plantation programmes have been taken up by the NSS unit and the Eco club of the College for increasing the green coverage in the campus. Awareness among the students and this staff on energy conservation is created by different seminars organized by different departments of the College concentrating on Environmental issues. Switching off all the electrical activities when our college campus is not in use and also solar light is placed in our college campus to save the environmental health.

5. Waste Management:

Plastic Waste: First of all, awareness on plastics material (and its life cycle), its uses and disposal will be there regularly among students. 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




MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

- MYC is a non-profit organisation for development of child and youth registered by Government of India, having its address at Boltala, Bishnupur, Bankura, Pin-722 122, West Bengal, India;

DESIRING to support the cooperation between the Parties in yoga training programs for healthy life and life skill development;

PURSUANT TO the prevailing laws and regulations, policies and procedures of India.

HAVE REACHED the following understanding:

ARTICLE 1 OBJECTIVE OF COOPERATION

ARTICLE 5 FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENT

- Any cooperation under this MOU is subject to the availability of funding sources and approval by relevant authorities
- ii) Any specific project of joint interest will be settled mutually.

ARTICLE 6 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

- Each Party shall protect, within its territory, intellectual property rights of the other party in accordance with the domestic law
- ii) In case of specific arrangement, programs or projects that may result in intellectual property, the Parties shall conclude separate arrangement in accordance with their respective laws and regulations.

ARTICLE 7 CONFIDENTIALITY

In the event that either Party wishes to disclose any data and/or information supplied in or resulted from the implementation of this MOU, the disclosing Party shall have prior written consent from the other Party.

ARTICLE 8 LIMITATION OF PERSONNEL ACTIVITIES

The Parties shall ensure that their personnel engaged in the activities under this MOU shall engage only in activities under the framework of this MOU with respect to national laws and regulations.

ARTICLE 9 SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

Any dispute concerning the interpretation and/or application of this MOU shall be settled amicably through consultation or negotiation between the Parties.

ARTICLE 10 AMENDMENT

i) This MOU may be amended or revised at any time by mutual written consent of The Parties, and such amendment shall form an integral part of this MOU.

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ARTICLE 10 AMENDMENT

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ARTICLE 11 ENTRY INTO FORCE, DURATION AND TERMINATION

This MOU shall enter into force on the date of signing.

- Either Party may terminate this MOU at any time by giving written notification to the other Party on its intention to terminate this MOU, six (6) months prior to the date of the termination.
- The termination of this MOU shall not affect the completion of any projects and programs in progress and not completed at the time of termination.
