Memorandum of Understanding

PARTIES

UNIVERSITY OF WOLLONGONG (ABN 61 060 567 686) of Northfields Avenue, Wollongong, NSW, Australia 2522 (UOW)

BANKURA UNIVERSITY of (1913242298100) of Main Campus, P.O. Purandarpur, Dist Bankura, PIN 722155, West Bengal, INDIA (BU)

BACKGROUND

- A. UOW is an Australian educational institution conducting research and providing world-class education to international and domestic students.
- B. BU is an Indian educational institution and centre of higher learning providing quality education to students.
- C. To facilitate collaboration between the Parties and discussions regarding activities of mutual benefit, this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) establishes the foundation of the relationship between the Parties.

TERMS

1. PURPOSE

- 1.1 The purpose of this MOU is to establish, develop and expand the co-operative relationship between the Parties.
- 1.2 By signing this MOU, the Parties intend to facilitate discussions regarding the establishment, development and management of Activities which are mutually beneficial to the Parties, their staff and, where applicable, their students.

2. DURATION

- 2.1 This MOU will take effect from the Commencement Date and will expire at the conclusion of the Term, unless terminated earlier in accordance with clause 7.
- 2.2 The Parties may extend the Term of this MOU by agreement in writing at any time prior to the expiry of the Term, or the expiry of any extension to the Term.

3. IMPLEMENTATION

- 3.1 The Parties will:
 - (a) identify Activities they wish to engage in collaboratively from time to time;
 - (b) discuss the identified Activities with a view to reaching agreement on the terms of cooperation for each Activity; and
 - (c) where agreement is reached, enter into a separate legally binding written agreement for each Activity, prior to the implementation of that Activity (Activity Agreement).
- 3.2 The Parties anticipate that an Activity Agreement will specify, where relevant:
 - (a) the nature and location of the Activity;
 - (b) the responsibilities and liabilities of each Party, including the services and resources to be provided by each Party;

- (c) the ownership, use and management of intellectual property arising from our contributed to the Activity;
 - (d) financial arrangements, the application of fees and charges and the apportionment of costs arising from the Activity;
 - (e) any relevant regulations, academic policies or other policies applying to the conduct of the Activity;
 - (f) any applicable governance arrangements; and
 - (g) any other items necessary for the efficient management of the Activity.
- 3.3 It is intended that each Activity Agreement will:
- (a) be binding on the Parties; and
 - (b) operate as a separate and formal agreement.

4. SCOPE

- 4.1 Nothing in this MOU prevents the Parties from collaboratively pursuing any other activities not contemplated in this MOU.
- 4.2 This MOU does not create any exclusive relationship between the Parties that would prevent the Parties from pursuing in their own right or with any other partner, activities similar to the Activities.
- 4.3 Except for rights and obligations arising from clauses 5, 6 and 9.2 of this MOU, this MOU does not:
- (a) constitute or create, and may not be deemed to constitute a legally binding document;
 - (b) give rise to any legal relationship between the Parties; or
 - (c) create any enforceable rights or duties between the Parties.
- 4.4 Nothing in this MOU obliges a Party to:
- (a) incur any cost or expense;
 - (b) undertake any work; or
 - (c) take any action;
- except as specified in any separate agreement executed by the Parties in connection with an Activity contemplated by this MOU..

5. CONFIDENTIALITY

- 5.1 Each Party (Receiving Party) must keep Confidential Information received from another Party (Disclosing Party) confidential and only use such Confidential Information for the purposes contemplated in this MOU.
- 5.2 If a Receiving Party is required by the operation of law or regulation, judicial or parliamentary body or government agency to disclose Confidential Information received from a Disclosing Party, the Receiving Party may comply with the requirement provided that the Receiving Party has first given notice to the Disclosing Party of the required disclosure and has given notice to the third party the information is Confidential Information of the Disclosing Party.
- 5.3 On termination of this MOU, or on the written direction of the Disclosing Party, the Receiving Party must immediately, at the Disclosing Party's option, return, delete or destroy all Confidential Information belonging to the Disclosing Party. This clause 5.3 is subject to compliance with any laws or legal requirements applicable to a Party in relation to record-keeping.
- 5.4 The obligations in this clause 5 are legally binding and survive expiration or termination of this MOU, for 3 years.

6. PUBLIC STATEMENTS

- 6.1 A Party may not use the name, image or logo of another Party without first obtaining the prior written consent of that Party.
- 6.2 A Party may not make any press releases or public statements containing:
- (a) this MOU; or
 - (b) details of Activities to be undertaken as a result of this MOU;
- without the prior written consent of each other Party.
- 6.3 The Parties will work together to gain mutually beneficial public visibility of the ongoing relationship.
- 6.4 The obligations in this clause 6 are legally binding and survive expiration or termination of this MOU.

7. TERMINATION

- 7.1 This MOU may be terminated
- (a) by a Party giving each other Party at least 3 months' prior notice in writing; or
 - (b) at any time by mutual written agreement.

7.2 The termination of this MOU will not affect the validity of any Activity agreement executed by the Parties as a result of this MOU.

8. NOTICES

8.1 A notice or other communication in connection with this MOU must be in writing and sent by electronic mail, prepaid priority letter (air mail if international) or courier to the addressed attached to this MOU, as applicable to each Party.

9. GENERAL

VARIATION

9.1 A variation of this MOU must be in writing and signed by the authorised representatives of each Party.

RELATIONSHIP

9.2 This MOU does not create any legal partnership, trust, joint venture, agency or employee relationship between the Parties. A Party may not enter into any agreement or incur any liabilities on behalf or behalf of another Party and may not represent to any person that it has the authority to do so.

LANGUAGE

9.3 Where this MOU is executed in both English and another language and there is an inconsistency in interpretation between the two languages, the Parties agree that the version of this MOU executed in English will prevail to the extent of that inconsistency.

COSTS

9.4 Each Party will bear its own costs associated with the negotiation, preparation and execution of this MOU.

EXECUTION

9.5 This MOU may be executed by one party signing the MOU and sending a scan of that signed version to the other Party by electronic means and the second Party countersigning the copy of the MOU signed by the first Party. Where there is more than two Parties to this MOU, this process may be repeated.

9.6 Delivery of a signed copy of the MOU by electronic means will have the same effect as delivering a signed original.

10. INTERPRETATION

10.1 In this MOU:-

- (a) **Activities** means collaborative activities, including but not limited to:
 - (i) academic visits for research, lectures and consultation;
 - (ii) credit transfer/articulation arrangement at the undergraduate and/or postgraduate level;
 - (iii) joint research activities and publications in areas of common interest;
 - (iv) participation in seminars;
 - (v) exchange of educational and academic materials and other information;
 - (vi) participation of joint conferences, seminars, workshops, academic meetings, and other activities agreed by both parties;
 - (vii) identification and discussion of areas of mutual interest for further potential collaboration;
 - (viii) reception of fee-paying students in programs at LCUW and its controlled entities
- and **Activity** means any one of these or any other collaborative activity contemplated by the Parties;
- (b) **Commencement Date** means the date on which the last of the Parties executes this MOU;
- (c) **Confidential Information** means any information or data (in any form or medium, including verbal) owned or held by a Party which is marked as confidential, treated by a Party as confidential, or is otherwise by its nature confidential, except:
 - (i) information that is already in the public domain otherwise than as a result of a breach of this MOU; or
 - (ii) information that is disclosed with the prior written consent of the Disclosing Party.
- (d) **Parties** means the parties to this MOU and **Party** means any one of them; and
- (e) **Term** means five calendar years from the Commencement Date.

Bankura Sammilani College Kenduadihi, Bankura and Ramananda College

Bishnupur, Bankura both affiliated to Bankura University, are linked by common academic interest and seek to develop collaborations and exchanges in fields of shared interest and expertise. The activities undertaken pursuant to this **Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)** are based on a spirit of cooperation and reciprocity, that is intended to be of mutual benefit to both the institutions.

1. Purpose*

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) serves as a written understanding of agreed upon principles between **Bankura Sammilani College** and **Ramananda College** concerning a set of general academic objectives.

This is a non-binding agreement and is intended to clarify the nature and extent of the harmonizing activities that might be undertaken for the mutual benefit of the two institutions. Each institution will be responsible for managing its own expenses and also share as and when necessary. Commitments of specific institutional resources, personnel, space, facilities, or any other academic or intellectual activities considered hereunder may or may not be beyond the scope of this MoU. To the extent that the implementation of any agreed upon activity requires a commitment of resources, personnel, credit-bearing coursework, or intellectual property, a supplementary agreement will be negotiated and approved by the two parties before work on any of the projects can commence.

2. Objectives, Scope, and Major Activities*

Both institutions agree to encourage the development of the following types of activities:

- Visits and formal exchanges of faculty, scholars and administrators in specific areas of education, research and outreach.
- Cooperate in postgraduate education and training through library as well as laboratory resources.
- Organize joint conferences, symposia, or other scientific meetings on subjects of mutual interest.
- Exchange of academic information and materials.
- Pursue avenues for undergraduate and post graduate student exchange during the academic year or through summer / winter internship programs.
- Explore the possibilities for developing joint research programs and collaborations.
- Other exchange and cooperation programs such as extension activities to which both institutions agree.

3. Responsibilities of the Institutions*

The two institutions identify that the execution of any agreed upon activity will depend upon the interest and expertise of the individuals involved and the availability of financial resources, space and other resources. Accordingly, the functioning of any exchange and cooperative program based on this MoU shall be conferred and determined between the two institutions. It is further expected that both institutions will be compliant with all applicable Government of India and State legislations and University policies.

4. Duration and Option to Amend, Extend or Terminate*


This MoU will become effective when signed by authorities of both institutions. The agreement will remain in effect for five years from the date of signature given below, and may be renewed or amended by mutual agreement of the institutions. The institutions should agree to periodically review the activities undertaken and the progress made and to consult concerning amendments, renewal or termination of this MoU. Either authority may terminate this MoU at any time by providing written notice of such termination to the other authority.

5. General Terms*

This MoU is not intended to, and does not create any right, benefit, or trust responsibility, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or equity, by either party, its officers, employees, or agents against the other party, its officers, employees, or agents. Nothing in this MoU obligates either party to commit or transfer any funds, assets, or other resources in support of projects or activities between the two parties. Neither party will use the name of the other, either expressly or by implication, in any publicity, solicitation or advertisement without the express written approval of the other party to this MoU.

6. Signatures*



DEFINITIONS

Sexual harassment is any unwanted verbal or physical conduct or gesture of a sexual nature, impinged for sexual forces, or other behavior of a sexual nature that makes the recipient feel humiliated, offended, and/or intimidated. Sexual harassment also consists situations where such aforementioned conduct is made into a working requirement or where such conduct creates an intimidating, hostile, or inappropriate working environment. The recipient's reaction may be assessable considering the situation and circumstances at hand. In other words, sexual harassment is:

- 1) Misuse of sexual behaviour;
- 2) Request for sexual favours;
- 3) Verbal statement or physical action or gesture that describes a sexual act, or
- 4) Unwanted action of a sexual nature;
- a. The recipient has made it clear that the behavior is unwanted;
- b. The recipient feels humiliated, offended and/or intimidated by the conduct; or
- c. The perpetrator should have reasonably anticipated that the other person would be offended, humiliated and/or intimidated by the conduct.

Types of HARASSMENT :

Harassment may take the form of words, gestures or actions that tend to annoy, alarm, abuse, denigrate, intimidate, belittle, humiliates or enforce another or that create an intimidating, hostile or offensive work environment. Generally, there are three forms of harassment:

- I. Physical harassment: e.g. sexual violence or unwanted physical contact such as pinching, hitting or pushing;
- II. Verbal harassment: e.g. comments, offensive jokes, personal insults, derogatory language;
- III. Non-verbal sexual harassment: e.g. staring, taunting, whispering, threatening behavior, sexually suggestive gestures, or 'fixing' somebody out.

Examples of harassment:

- Use of ethnically derogatory words, phrases, epithets / Derogatiorization of a racial or ethnic nature such as a use of pejorative, derisive or derogatory words which offend a particular racial or ethnic group;
- Comments about an individual's skin colour or other racial, ethnic characteristics;
- Making disparaging remarks about an individual's gender that are not sexual in nature;
- Negative comments about a student's religious beliefs (or lack of religious beliefs);
- Expressing negative stereotypical regarding an employee's race/ethnic ancestry;
- Negative comments regarding an employee's age;
- Derogatory or humiliating references to an employee's marital or physical impairment;
- Prejudiced remarks or cartoons/jokes that have to do with an individual's personal talents, choosing, pronouns (he/she), ages, etc.
- sexual orientation. Sexual harassment and bullying are two of the most prevalent forms of workplace harassment.



PREVENTION MECHANISM:

The mechanism must include the following elements:

- a. A policy statement prohibiting harassment;
- b. A clear definition of what constitutes harassment;
- c. A complaints/grievance procedure;
- d. Disciplinary rules and penalties against the harasser and against those who make false accusations;
- e. Protective and remedial measures for the victim;
- f. Promotional and educational programs to explain the company policy regarding harassment;
- g. Training in nine instances of harassment and adverse consequences for breach of the policy;
- h. Should be provided to all employees, supervisors, and managers of the company;

Prohibition & Prevention Acts

- 1. 2006 Protection of Women from Sexual Harassment Act, 2006
- 2. The POSH Act has been implemented to prevent and protect from any sexual harassment at the workplace and thereby ensure a healthy working environment.
- 3. An Order of the Prevention of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012
- 4. To deal with child sexual abuse cases, the Government of India enacted the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012. The Act came into force on 1st October, 2012 along with the Rules issued thereunder.
